Gen Alfred H. Noble

Served as the Commanding General, Parris Island, from 21 February 1948 – 17 July 1950. Oversaw the integration of African American and female recruits into recruit training.



1915 LtCol Elias R. Beadle

Served as the first commander of 'Marine Barracks, Port Royal, SC', 1915 - 1917. Established the base as a Recruit Depot and commanded the initial training of Marines during WWI.



1957

Gen Wallace M. Greene Jr

Served as the Commanding General, Parris Island, from 16 March 1957 – 24 May 1958. Later became the 23rd Commandant of the Marine Corps from 1964-1967.

2ndLt Margaret Henderson

Served as the commander of the 3rd Recruit Training Battalion, the first female recruit training battalion at Parris Island. Later became the director of 'Women Marines' organization.



1959

Gen David M. Shoup

Served as the Commanding General, Parris Island, from 11 May 1959 – 19 October 1959. Later became the 22nd Commandant of the Marine Corps from 1960-1963.

1972

Gen Robert H. Barrow

Served as the Commanding General, Parris Island, from 14 October 1972 – 16 June 1975. Later became the 27th Commandant of the Marine Corps from 1979-1983.



2011

BGen Lori E. Reynolds

Served as the first female Commanding General, Parris Island, and the Eastern Recruiting Region from 17 June 2011 – 23 May 2014.



1975

SgtMaj Peter J. Marovich

Served as the first Sergeant Major, Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island from January 1975 - January 1977.



2014

BGen Terry V. Williams

Serving as the first African-American Commanding General, Parris Island, and the Eastern Recruiting Region beginning 23 May 2014.

1924

Iron Mike

Dedicated 25 July 1924, to the Marines who passed through the gates of Parris Island and gave their lives in World War I. Origin of term 'Iron Mike' is unknown.



1982

WWII Memorial

Dedicated on 3 July 1982, to the battalions who served with distinction in battles of WWII; such as Iceland, Guadalcanal, Tarawa, Guam, and Okinawa.



1951

War Memorial Building 111

Constructed between February 1950 and October 1951, to stand as a monument to Marines of the past and an inspiration and opportunity for the Marines of the future.

1952

Iwo Jima

Dedicated in 1952, to the Marines who raised the American flag in victory over Mount Surabachi; and to all those Marines who gave their lives during the battle of Iwo Jima.



1994

Peatross Parade Deck

Dedicated on 16 March 1994, in honor of Major General Oscar Peatross, who served with distinction in WWII, Korea, and Vietnam and was a former commanding general of Parris Island.

1999

Drill Instructor Monument

Dedicated on 24 April 1999, to all those who serve as Marine drill instructors and dedicated themselves to making Marines. The monument is inscribed with the Drill Instructor's Creed.



2006

Vietnam Monument

Dedicated on 30 June 2006, to all Marines who graduated from Parris Island and later proved their 'mettle' in Vietnam.



2002

Barrow Hall

Dedicated on 13 December 2002, in honor of General Robert H. Barrow, who served as the 27th Commandant of the Marine Corps and commanding general of Parris Island. Barrow Hall currently serves as the depot headquarters building.

Dedicated on 23 October 1999, to the founding women Marines, who first earned and wore the Eagle, Globe, and Anchor, and paved the way for women Marines of the future.

Purple Heart Monument

Dedicated 13 August 2008, to all Purple Heart recipients who fought in foreign wars to protect our nation's freedoms.



DEPOT MASCOTS


1915 - 2014

arris Island maintains a lasting tradition of Depot Mascots that serve as a symbol of the Depot's watchful eye, courageous nature and 'esprit de corps'. The mascot breeds have changed through the many years and were often the pet of a specific Marine or unit serving aboard the depot. Parris Island mascots are now considered to be active duty Marines and are expected to conduct themselves with the courage, professionalism and vigor found in our active corps. For their commitment to duty and discipline, they will be rewarded with awards and appropriate promotions. Failure to act accordingly could result in being charged in violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, and they will ultimately be held accountable for all actions.

Parris Island's first mascot was a full-blooded Irish terrier known as "Mike." He was born in 1905, and pulled tours of duty in Cuba in 1909, at Annapolis in 1910, and landed at Vera Cruz, Mexico, with the Marines in 1914. The following year he moved from the Norfolk recruit camp to Parris Island, South Carolina, where he became the depot's first mascot. Mike became seriously ill and died in 1916. He was buried adjacent to the historic dry dock, which serves as our mascot cemetery today. His 1916 grave is Parris Island's oldest monument.

Many dogs have served as the Depot mascot: 'Mike' - (1914 - 1916) (served in Cuba and Vera Cruz) 'Snoopy' – (World War II) 'Blitz' – (World War II) 'Getchy' - (1940) 'Duke O'Strathmore' - (1941 - 1944) 'Duke' - (1944 - 1945) Great Dane. (served in Pacific War) PFC 'Judge' - (1945) Bulldog. (served as women Marines mascot) 'Skipper' - (1945 - 1946) 'Sir Lord Windsor' – (1952) Bulldog. (fire station mascot) 'Sarge' – (1955) – Bulldog. (Parris Island Brig mascot) 'Iron Mike' - (1965) - Bulldog. 'Hubert The Valiant' - (1959-1967) Bulldog. Lance Corporal 'Klinker' - (1960 - 1966) Bulldog. 'Paul Bunyan' - (1966 - 1975) Bulldog. 'Baron' – (1968 - 1977) German Shepard. (Sentry Dog, Vietnam) Lord D. Chesterfield aka 'Chesty' – (1977 – 1983) Bulldog. "Thor' - (1983) Bulldog. (former Parris Island Brig mascot) 'Iron Mike' - (1996 - 2003) Bulldog. Sgt 'Archibald Hummer' – (2006 – 2011) Bulldog. 'Legend' - (2011 - Present) Bulldog.

Many of the above named mascots were disinterred from the main side mascot cemetery during the 1980s and moved to a high bluff overlooking Archer's Creek and facing the General R. C. Berkeley Bridge on nearby Horse Island.













1915 - 2014

n 28 October 1915, the Department of the Navy officially transferred Marine Corps recruit training from Norfolk, Virginia, to Parris Island, South Carolina. Among the first 750 Marines sent to Parris Island was the depot's first bandmaster, Sergeant William Gauer, and Sergeant Anton Schnichowski, the depot's first drum major, who with a group of Marine musicians, formed the Parris Island Marine Band. Until this time, musicians had been trained by individual bands, so a field music school was established at Parris Island to train buglers who were still being used for calls and signals. Musicians also doubled as marksmanship instructors, close combat instructors, and provided support for various units on the depot.

Today, the Marines of the Parris Island Marine Band make up the concert band, marching/ceremonial band, brass band, brass quintet and jazz combo. The Parris Island Marine Band's primary mission is to provide musical support for recruit graduations and other military ceremonies and events. In addition to playing at approximately 40 recruit graduations each year, the band also performs concerts and parades across the United States. The band's most recent awards include the 2009 and 2013 Col. George S. Howard Citation for Musical Excellence for Military Concert Bands.
