



- Review all proposed activities for potential environmental impacts in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act. Minimize our impact on the environment through sustainable development, environmental quality assessments, education, pollution prevention, and use of geographic information systems technology.
- Promote cleanup of contaminated sites.
- Maintain and enhance the biodiversity of our ecosystem through integrated natural resource management.
- Conserve our air, land, and water resources as vital and fundamental Marine Corps assets.
