Subj: STANDING OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER

Encl: (1) Administrative Black Flag Procedures

1. Situation. The Emergency Communications Center (ECC) operates the 911 emergency telephone system which is designed to provide immediate access to an emergency services dispatcher during an emergency situation. The Marine Corps Recruit Depot/ Eastern Recruiting Region, Parris Island (MCRD/ERR, PI) Fire and Emergency Services (PIFES) is tasked with centralized ECC responsibilities aboard MCRD/ERR, PI.

2. Cancellation. DepO 2260.2D

3. Mission. To publish information and procedures pertaining to the ECC aboard MCRD/ERR, PI.

4. Execution.

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. The PIF&ES will serve as the functional section aboard MCRD/ERR, PI that provides 911 emergency services.

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) For emergency law enforcement, fire, medical or any emergency response, personnel should dial 911 from any telephone that is part of the Depot telephone system. Once connected, personnel should give their name and description of the situation, to include location. If dialing 911 from a cell phone, personnel should notify the Beaufort County Emergency Dispatcher that the call should be forwarded to the MCRD/ERR, PI ECC. All Land Mobile Radio (LMR) handheld radios from Navy Medical, RTR and WFTBN shall be programmed with the emergency 911 radio channel, this channel can be used 24/7 aboard the Depot to contact the ECC.

(b) For certain training events to take place, an immediate Advance Life Saving (ALS) and transport capability must be available aboard the Depot and able to respond. These training events are all live fire evolutions at the Weapons area, pugil stick training, combat water survival training in the water, and high obstacle training at the confidence course (A-frame, stairway, and skyscraper). PIFES ALS units constitute the required emergency response capability. If such capability is not available, the above mentioned training will cease until immediate ALS capabilities are available.

(c) Red Dog/Blanket Emergencies. Red Dog signifies an emergency response requirement at the Combat Training Pool and/or outdoor pool. Red Blanket signifies a firearms incident with injury at the Weapons area.

1. When a red dog situation occurs, pool personnel shall notify the ECC via the existing emergency phone (primary), by dialing 911 (secondary), or by utilizing the 911 channel on the LMR network and advise the ECC of the incident. FIFES will respond.

2. When a red blanket situation occurs, Weapons and Field Training Battalion (WFTBN) personnel shall dial 911 (primary) or utilize the 911 channel on the LMR network (secondary) and advise the ECC of the incident. FIFES will respond.

(d) Other 911 Incidents. Requests for emergency assistance at Page Field, other training areas or anywhere aboard MCRD/ERR, PI will be made by dialing 911 or by utilizing the 911 channel on the LMR. In the case of non-medical emergencies reported via 911, the ECC will determine the nature of the emergency and dispatch the appropriate emergency assets.

b. Subordinate Element Mission

(1) Provost Marshal Office (PMO). Respond to all 911 calls. The Provost Marshal or senior law enforcement officer on scene will serve as the incident commander for those situations under the cognizance of the PMO.

(2) PIFES

(a) The Fire Chief is assigned responsibility for the operation of the Depot's firefighting, ALS, and rescue assets.

(b) PIFES firefighters and paramedics shall respond to all fire emergencies, fire alarms and hazardous material emergencies. The senior PIFES Officer or designee on scene will serve as the Incident Commander for those situations under the cognizance of the PIFES.

(c) Provide first response for all medical emergencies.

(d) The Fire Chief or designee will act as the Depot's representative in coordinating backup medical services during Administrative Black Flag conditions.

(3) Branch Health Clinic (BHC). Responsible for the operation of the BHC acute care. BHC will notify PIFES when the cool room is available or any change in status is made for the ability to transport heat cases from PIFES to the BHC.

(4) Coordinating Instructions

(a) PIFES is assigned responsibility of maintaining the ECC and 911 dispatchers.

(b) Training of all civilian dispatchers will be supervised by the PIFES. The Assistant Chief of Prevention, also assigned as the ECC Director. The Assistant Chief of Prevention will ensure the dispatchers are qualified to receive and handle all calls for emergency services.

(c) The Assistant Chief of Training emergency management services vehicle, Engine 521, 523, 524, Medic 51, 52, 53 and 54 can provide ALS services aboard the Depot.

(d) Medics 51, 52, 53 and 54 are the only assets aboard the Depot capable of transporting a seriously injured individual to a medical facility.

(e) The BMC ambulances aboard the Depot do not have ALS equipment and will not be used at any time to transport seriously injured individuals to any medical facility.

(f) If backup medical services from Beaufort County are utilized, a PMO unit should be available to meet the ambulance at the main gate in order to escort the unit to requested area.

(g) Enclosure (1) identifies dispatch procedures for Administrative Black Flag Conditions.

5. Administration and Logistics


a. Recommendations for changes or modifications to this order will be provided to the PIFES for staffing to the AC/S G-1. The G-1 will staff this order to the appropriate subordinate commands and staff sections for consideration and will implement any changes or revisions.

a. Command. This Order is applicable to all personnel aboard MCRD/ERR, PI.

Administrative Black Flag Procedures

1. As outlined in the Order, continuous and immediate ALS capability must be available for the Depot to conduct certain training. In the event that the ALS units are off the Depot, the following procedures will be followed:

a. During working hours the Duty Chief or the ECC Dispatcher will make the following notifications when there is not an ALS unit available aboard the Depot.

(1) G-3, Emergency Operations Center (EOC) 3698/3712

(2) Beaufort County Dispatch at 843-524-2777

b. After working hours make the following notifications when no ALS unit is available aboard the Depot.

(1) G-3, Emergency Operations Center (EOC) 3698/3712

(2) Beaufort County Dispatch at 843-524-2777

c. When notifying G-3 EOC state: "We are now in an Administrative Black Flag Condition. All physical training, field training, and weapons training is suspended. All personnel are required to use extreme caution to ensure no additional injuries occur. You will be notified when ALS transport capability is available".

d. Once ALS transport capability is available, the ECC will notify G-3 EOC and Beaufort County Dispatcher immediately and state: "We are no longer in an Administrative Black Flag Condition, you may resume suspended training".

e. The EOC will utilize the Mass Notification System to sound the Administrative Black Flag Condition during the hours of 0530-2100 only over the big voice intercom system. This message will be accompanied by an all hands message sent through AtHoc desktop notification system. The same process will be used to terminate Administrative Black Flag Conditions.
