1. Situation. Emphasis on marksmanship training proficiency is an essential factor in preparing Marines for combat. Competitive shooting provides a method for stimulating interest in marksmanship and offers advanced marksmanship training to selected individuals. Participation in the Competition-in-Arms Program (CIAP) is highly encouraged for qualified members of this command.

2. Cancellation. DepO 3591.4K

3. Mission. In accordance with the references, provide guidance concerning the composition and operation of the PIRPT.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent

(a) The Parris Island Rifle and Pistol Team (PIRPT) will be established per references (a) and (b) and will remain active throughout the year.

(b) The PIRPT will be composed of a Team Captain, one (1) Weapons Repairman, and a minimum of eight (8), but no more than 20 competitors. Their primary duty will be competitive shooting, as outlined in reference (b).

DISTRIBUTION STATEMENT A: Approved for public release; distribution is unlimited.

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) The Officer-in-Charge (OIC) of the PIRPT will have broad discretion in choosing team members. The OIC may use a combination of competitive selection (e.g., a shoot-off), previous experience in Division Matches, or distinguished status. The primary means of selecting new team members is via the Depot Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition.

(c) Marines selected for the PIRPT will be assigned to Weapons and Field Training Battalion (WFTBN) on Temporary Active Duty (TAD) by non-funded TAD orders issues from their parent command. Marines who are replaced on the team by more qualified shooters, regardless of previously demonstrated skill, will return to their parent command.

b. Subordinate Element Missions

(1) Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3

(a) Maintain staff cognizance over activities of the PIRPT.

(b) Coordinate with commanders to minimize conflicts concerning membership in the PIRPT.

(2) Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4

(a) Provide weapons as requested by the Commanding Officer of WFTBN for training, civilian matches, and the CIAP.

(b) Provide the PIRPT with ammunition as required, and assist with proper allocation of ammunition to match-hosting bases, via the Total Ammunition Management Information System (TAMIS) in order to minimize the physical transportation of ammunition off base by PIRPT personnel.

(c) The PIRPT will use rental vehicles, two (2) 15-seat passenger vans and one (1) box trailer or stake-bed truck, in order to transport personnel and weapons on and off-base.

(3) Assistant Chief of Staff, G-8. Provide support per reference (d).

(4) Commanding Officer, WFTBN

(a) Designate an OIC for the PIRPT.

(b) Organize, train, and assume administrative control over the PIRPT.

(c) Equip the team and provide ammunition per reference (d). Ensure that PIRPT equipment is segregated from all other equipment, is used only by team members, and used only in direct support of the activities of the PIRPT.

(d) Ensure the team participates in competitive matches as directed.

(e) Use the fund administrator account as established by the AC/S, G-8 for the accounting and control of PIRPT material and services funds.

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(f) Submit budgetary requirements during annual Operations and Maintenance (O&M) budget calls and program reviews to the AC/S, G-8 per published guidance.

(g) Coordinate with AC/S, G-4 to arrange transportation for team weapons, equipment, and personnel.

(h) Coordinate with the Depot Ammunition Officer to ensure allocation of ammunition in TAMIS in order to avoid unnecessary transportation of ammunition by PIRPT personnel.

(5) Commanding Officer, Headquarters and Service Battalion. Provide the PIRPT with a rifle equipment/weapons repairman, Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) 2112, to serve as the rifle team armorer.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) All Commanders

(a) Encourage those Marines interested in and qualified for competitive shooting to compete for a position on the PIRPT through the Depot Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition.

(b) Make available for tryout periods all qualified Marines interested in competitive shooting.

(2) The Depot Armory will provide all competition weapons.

(3) Competitors may use personal weapons per reference (d). Personal weapons must have a current Limited Technical Inspection/Pre-Fire Inspection (LTI/PFI) from the team's armorer.

(4) Government supplied ammo shall not be fired through personal weapons.

5. Administration and Logistics.

a. Recommendations for changes or modifications to this Order will be provided to the AC/S, G-3.

b. Directives issued by MCRD/ERR PI are published and distributed electronically. Electronic versions can be viewed on the G-1 SharePoint.

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This order is applicable to MCRD/ERR PI.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.

Government weapons in a locked, unattended vehicle are not considered properly secured. Weapons must be stored in an appropriate facility. Weapons will not be stored in military quarters, motels, or civilian housing while at the commitment site. The weapons will be stored in armories of U.S. military bases, reserve training centers, or ROTC units if available. If not available, local police will be contacted for storage and security during the periods the weapons are not in actual use.

4. Upon the conclusion of the commitment, you will proceed directly to the Depot Armory and turn in those weapons listed above.

5. In the event a weapon listed above becomes missing, you are to immediately call the chain of command and the Depot Armory at (843) 228-2093/2648/4696/ 3773 or (843)321-2774.
