DEPOT ORDER 1710.31A

Subj: CHILDREN IN SELF-CARE

Ref: (a) MCO 1710.30E (Children, Youth and Teen Programs)

1. Situation. HQMC mandates that installations establish standardized guidelines concerning the minimum age at which children may be left in "self-care" and may be left in the care of older children. This guidance is presented in the context that all parents are responsible and accountable for their child(ren) at all times.
2. Cancellation. DepO 1710.31.
3. Mission. This Order is applicable to service members and their families residing in government quarters aboard MCRD Parris Island, Naval Hospital Beaufort, Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort, and Laurel Bay government housing. Questions concerning the appropriate age at which a child may be left in self-care often arise. Reference (a) states that "Installation Commanders shall establish policies and standard operating procedures that shall address all aspects of the child development and youth programs provided on the installation to include a "home alone" or "self care" policy that incorporates "self release" standards and sign in/sign out guidelines for children under the age of twelve."
4. Execution
 - a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations
 - (1) Commander's Intent. Parents are responsible and accountable for their children at all times. This directive establishes minimal guidelines, but in no way abdicates parental responsibility for supervision of their children. Parents, guardians, or designated caretakers of children are expected to have full accountability of their children to ensure that they are safe and not left without direct accountable supervision, age-appropriate, for any period of time. This includes such situations as being unattended in quarters, left alone overnight, participation in self-release programs, unattended in vehicles, and unattended on playgrounds.

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(2) Concept of Operations. Several important variables, in addition to age criteria must be considered before parents decide their child(ren) safely can be left in self-care. These factors include maturity of the child; duration and frequency of time without direct supervision; the child's knowledge of emergency procedures; presence of physically and/or emotionally handicapping conditions; accessibility to parent or other specified or informed caretakers; number and ages of other children present without direct adult supervision; age appropriateness of responsibilities given to the child; and specific nature of ongoing child activities while unsupervised.

b. Tasks

(1) When a reasonable suspicion exists that the responsible adult(s) did not properly consider and apply these relevant factors, the Provost Marshal's Office will be notified.

(2) Parents who have children in self care must give them self-care instructions to include emergency procedures and phone numbers.

(3) Children babysitting other children aboard MCRD, BNH, Laurel Bay, and MCAS Beaufort are encouraged to complete the American Red Cross Baby Sitters Course offered through the Children, Youth and Teen Program.

(4) The following chart outlines the minimum ages for child supervisory requirements.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Definitions

(a) Babysitting: An agreement to care for another's child or sibling on an occasional basis, defined as less than 10 child care hours per week, either in the sitter's or the child's home. The babysitter may or may not be paid for services, depending upon agreements reached between the babysitter and the parent(s).

(b) Parent: The biological father or mother of a child; a person who, by order of a court or competent jurisdiction, has been declared the father or mother of a child by adoption; the legal guardian of a child; or a person in whose household a child resides, provided that such person stands in loco parentis to that child and contributes at least one half of the child's support.

(c) Self-care: Supervisory category when the child is responsible for himself or herself and generally includes children who are responsible for him or herself before or after school, during school vacations, and holidays.

(d) Self release from the Youth Center: Parental approval is granted for a youth to sign himself or herself into and out of activities offered at the Youth Center. Parent(s) shall specify the allowable destination(s) (i.e., home or the parent's work location) for their children who self release.

(e) Instructed supervision: A parent has given very specific instructions to the child, e.g., a child can be allowed to walk or ride a bike to school with specific instructions from the parents that he or she is to walk straight to and from school and back again with no stops or delays along the way.

(f) Auditory and visual supervision: Parents of children ages 4 and 5 who walk to school must provide auditory and visual supervision of the child. (Children 10 and older may be granted responsibility to provide supervision to children 4 and older when walking to and from school).

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5. Administration and Logistics. Recommendations concerning the contents of this Order are encouraged and invited. Recommendations should be submitted to the Director, MCCS (Attn: Children, Youth and Teen Program Administrator).

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to all commands and personnel assigned to MCRD/ERR, Parris Island.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.
