Subj: STANDING OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR CENTRAL DISPATCH CENTER

1. Situation. The Central Dispatch Center 911 emergency telephone system is designed to provide immediate access to an emergency services dispatcher during an emergency situation. The Provost Marshal's Office (PMO) along with the Fire/Rescue Division (FRD) are jointly tasked with centralized dispatch responsibilities aboard the Depot. The Central Dispatch Center is responsible for the timely dispatch of all emergency services assets to calls for emergency services.

2. Cancellation. DepO 2060.2B.

3. Mission. To publish information and procedures pertaining to the Central Dispatch Center aboard the Depot.

4. Execution. The functional sections aboard the Depot which provide 911 emergency services are: the Military Police District (MPD) and the Fire Rescue Division (FRD).

a. Concept

(1) For emergency military police, fire, and medical response, personnel should dial 911 from any telephone which is part of the Depot telephone system, and give their name and description of the situation.

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(2) For certain training events to take place, an immediate Advance Life Saving (ALS) and transport capability must be available aboard the Depot and able to respond. These training events are: all live firing at the rifle range; pugil stick training; combat water survival training in the water; and high obstacle training at the confidence course A-frame, stairway, and skyscraper. Medic-1 and Medic-3 constitutes the required capability. If such capability is not available, the above mention training will cease until such time as immediate ALS/transport capability is available.

b. Red Dog/Blanket Emergencies. Red Dog signifies an emergency response requirement at the Combat Training Pool and/or outdoor pool. Red Blanket signifies a firearms accident and injury at the Rifle Range.

(1) When a Red Dog situation occurs, pool personnel will notify the Central Emergency Dispatcher via the existing emergency phone (primary) or by dialing 911 (backup). Medic-1 or Medic-3 will be dispatched immediately.

(2) When a Red Blanket situation occurs, Weapons and Field Training Battalion (WFTBN) personnel will dial 911 and will advise Central Emergency Dispatcher of the incident. Medic-1 or Medic-3 will be dispatched immediately.

c. Other 911 Incidents. Requests for emergency assistance at Page Field or other training areas will be made by dialing 911. In case of non-medical emergencies reported via 911, the Central Emergency Dispatcher will determine the nature of the emergency and dispatch the appropriate emergency assets.

d. Task

(1) MPD: Will respond to all 911 calls. The Provost Marshal or senior military policeman on scene will serve as the incident commander for those situations under the cognizance of the MPD. Neither the incident commander nor military policeman will interfere with emergency medical treatment.

(2) FRD

(a) Per reference (b) and (c), the Fire Chief is assigned responsibility for the operation of the Depot's firefighting, paramedic, and rescue assets.

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(b) FRD firefighters and paramedics will respond to all fire emergencies, fire alarms and hazardous material emergencies. Additionally, the senior FRD officer or designee on scene will serve as the incident commander for those situations under the cognizance of the FRD.

(c) Provide first response to all medical emergencies.

(d) The Fire Chief or his designee will act as the Depot's representative in coordinating backup medical service.

(3) Branch Health Clinic Medical (BHMC). Responsible for the operation of the Branch Medical Clinic's acute care and ambulance assets.

e. Coordinating Instructions

(1) MPD and FRD are equally assigned responsibility of maintaining 911 dispatcher assets.

(2) Training of all civilian/military dispatchers will be a joint effort of MPD/FRD. The Provost Marshal and Assistant Chief of Fire Prevention will ensure that the dispatchers are qualified to receive and handle calls for emergency service.

(3) The Assistant Chief of Training's vehicle, Engine-1, Engine-3, Medic-1, Medic-2, and Medic-3 can provide Advanced Life Support (ALS) treatment.

(4) Medic-1, Medic-2, and Medic-3 are the only assets aboard the Depot capable of transporting a seriously injured individual to a medical facility.

(5) The BHMC ambulance does not have ALS equipment and will be used only in extremis cases to transport seriously injured individuals to a medical facility.

(6) If a backup medical service from Beaufort County is utilized, an MP unit will meet the ambulance at the Main Gate.

(7) Enclosure (1) identifies dispatch procedures for Administrative Black Flag Conditions.


5. Administration and Logistics. This Order contains a significant number of changes and should be reviewed in its entirety.

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6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, SC.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.

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ADMINISTRATIVE BLACK FLAG PROCEDURES

1. As outlined in the basic order, continuous and immediate ALS/transport capability must be available for the Depot to conduct certain training. In the event that Medic-1 and Medic-3 are off the depot, the following procedures will be followed:

a. During working hours, make the following notifications when both MEDIC-1 and MEDIC-3 are off the Depot:

- (1) RTR S-3 at 228-3273/2718.
- (2) WFTBN S-3 at 228-3498/3183/3624.
- (3) HQSVBN S-3 at 3441.
- (4) Combat Training Pool at 228-3804/2981.
- (5) Branch Health Clinic Medical at 228-2562/3346/2892.
- (6) G-3 at 228-3698.
- (7) Beaufort County Dispatcher at 524-2777.

b. After working hours, make the following notifications when MEDIC-1 and MEDIC-3 are off the Depot:

- (1) RTR OOD at 228-3273.
- (2) WFTBN OOD at 228-3170.
- (3) HQSVBN OOD at 228-3183.
- (4) CDO at 228-3712.
- (5) Beaufort County Dispatcher at 524-2777.

c. When notifying WFTBN, RTR, HQSVBN, Combat Training Pool, BHCM, G-3, state: "We are now in an Administrative Black Flag Condition. All physical training, field training, and weapons training is suspended. All personnel are required to use extreme caution to ensure no additional injuries occur. You will be notified when ALS transport capability is available".

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d. Once ALS transport capability is available, the Central Dispatch Center will notify WFTBN, RTR, HQSVCBN, Combat Training Pool, BHCM, G-3, and Beaufort County Dispatcher immediately and state: "We are no longer in an Administrative Black Flag Conditions, you may resume suspended training".
