Subj: INTRAMURAL RIFLE AND PISTOL COMPETITION PROGRAM

1. Situation. Marksmanship proficiency is one of the core components of a Marine's readiness. All Marines, regardless of Military Occupational Specialty (MOS), must be proficient with their assigned weapon and knowledgeable about its operating capabilities. Marksmanship competition is a proven means of enhancing and sustaining this proficiency and knowledge.

2. Cancellation. DepO 3590.6F.

3. Mission. To establish a Command Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition for all eligible permanent personnel, and to publish information and instructions concerning this competition.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. The Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition will be conducted annually during the first quarter of the fiscal year in order to foster a spirit of competition and to identify potential participants in the Depot Rifle and Pistol Team and the Competition-in-Arms Program (CIAP)

(2) Concept of Operations. The competition will be conducted as outlined in enclosure (1). Individual and organizational team match firing will be conducted using the Annual Qualification Course of Fire for both the rifle and pistol, as described in enclosure (2). No limit will be placed on the number of individual competitors that may be entered by a command.

b. Tasks

(1) (AC/S) Operations and Training (G-3). Publish Depot Bulletins pertaining to the Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition Program.

(2) Commanding Officer, Weapons and Field Training Battalion (WFTBN)

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(a) Organize and administer the Depot Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition Program.

(b) Announce the dates and schedule for the Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition no later than four to six weeks before the beginning of the new fiscal year (FY).

(c) Designate a Match Executive Officer for the competition.

(d) Coordinate with the AC/S, Installation and Logistics (G-4) to ensure dining facility support, including bag lunches for all competing or supporting personnel with meal cards.

(e) Attempt to field a minimum of two teams for both rifle and pistol competition. Select the best-qualified shooters eligible to compete, per the provisions of this Order.

(f) Encourage participation of individuals who have displayed proficiency in marksmanship.

(g) Coordinate with Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS) to provide awards for the competitors, as described in this Order.

(3) Commanding Officer, Recruit Training Regiment (RTR)

(a) Attempt to field a minimum of two teams for both rifle and pistol competition. Select the best-qualified shooters eligible to compete, per the provisions of this Order.

(b) Encourage participation of individuals who have displayed proficiency in marksmanship.

(c) Provide the Commanding Officer, WFTBN, with any necessary personnel to assist the Match Executive Officer in supporting the Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition.

(4) Commanding Officer, Headquarters and Service Battalion (HQSVCBN)

(a) Attempt to field a minimum of two teams for both rifle and pistol competition. Select the best-qualified shooters eligible to compete, per the provisions of this Order.

(b) Encourage participation of individuals who have displayed proficiency in marksmanship.

(c) Provide the Commanding Officer, WFTBN, with any necessary personnel to assist the Match Executive Officer in supporting the Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition.

(5) Director, MCCS. Provide appropriate awards to teams and individuals as requested by the Commanding Officer, WFTBN.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) During the Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition, all competitors will be afforded the opportunity to qualify with both rifle and pistol as required annually by reference (a).

(2) Eligibility requirements for the individual and team matches are listed below:

(a) Marines participating in the Depot Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition should not have an End of Active Service (EAS), or Rotation Tour Date (RTD) prior to the end of that fiscal year's CIAP. The Match Executive Officer may waive the EAS/RTD requirement.

(b) Marines who have not won an individual award (leg badge) in the CIAP may compete. The winning of an individual award with one weapon (rifle or pistol) does not prevent the individual from competing with the other weapon.

(c) Marines who have won individual awards (leg badges) in the CIAP may not compete but may serve as non-firing members, such as team captain or coach. Commanders are strongly encouraged to use these Marines to reinforce the training of other participants.

(3) Rifle and Pistol Team Composition

(a) Each team competing in the intramural matches must have a minimum of four eligible competitors; the maximum is seven.

(b) Teams will consist of four shooting members, a team captain, and a coach; teams may have a fifth shooting member as an alternate. The team captain and coach may also be shooting members of their team, if they are eligible.

(c) Each team must have at least one officer, but no more than two. There is no limit on the number of officers shooting.

(d) No competitor may be assigned to more than one team in each of the rifle and pistol team matches. Firing members of each must have fired the same type of weapon as in the intramural individual matches.

(e) There is no limit to the number of teams that each command may enter in the team matches, provided that all commands have an opportunity to enter the same number of teams.

(f) Competitors must be permanently assigned to the unit they represent.

(g) Match regulations will closely parallel those of the CIAP, reference (b), to the fullest extent possible. The decision of the Match Executive Officer on all challenges and protests is final.

(h) The Branch Health Clinic-Medical and the Branch Health Clinic-Dental are invited to participate in the program. Other Depot units may submit teams if desired.

5. Administration and Logistics

a. The Depot Armory will provide all competition weapons. Competitors may not use personal weapons.

b. Weapons to be used in the Intramural Competition will be drawn from the Depot Armory. Alterations or modifications of weapons are not allowed. Personal weapons are not authorized for competition.

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c. All participants will travel by government vehicle only. All weapons must be returned to the Depot Armory immediately after cease-fire.

d. Due to a heavy schedule during the live firing days, there will be no break for the noon meal. Competitors and the support personnel on COMRATS are advised to pack a lunch. The WFTBN Mess Hall will provide bag lunches for all personnel with meal cards.

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island and the Tri-Command area.

b. Signal. This Order is effective on the date signed.

1. The following course of fire will be used in only Individual Rifle Match. This is the Annual Rifle Course.

3. Equipment

- a. Authorized weapons are the M-16A4 Service Rifle or M-4 Carbine with RCO and M-9 9mm Service Pistol.
- b. Only ammunition issued at the site of the match will be used in practice and competition.
- c. Rifle and Pistol magazines and pouches, with a minimum of 6 rifle and 2 pistol magazines.
- d. Vicker Sling: a 2-point or 3-point Vicker sling is authorized.
