1. Situation. Emphasis on marksmanship training proficiency is an essential factor in preparing Marines for combat. Competitive shooting provides a method for stimulating interest in marksmanship and offers advanced marksmanship training to selected individuals. Participation in the Competition-in-Arms Program (CIAP) is encouraged for qualified members of this command.

2. Cancellation. DepO 3591.4J.

3. Mission. To provide guidance concerning the composition and operation of the DRPT in accordance with the references.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. The Depot Rifle and Pistol Team (DRPT) will be established per references (a) and (b). The team will be activated every year, normally during December, by the Commanding Officer, Weapons and Field Training Battalion (WFTBN), and disbanded upon completion of the Marine Corps Matches, normally in August.

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) The DRPT will be composed of a Team Captain, one Weapons Repairman, and 16 competitors. Their primary duty will be competitive shooting, as outlined in reference (b).

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(b) The Officer-in-Charge (OIC) of the DRPT will have broad discretion in choosing team members. The OIC may use a combination of competitive selection (e.g., a shoot-off), recommendations of range OICs, shooters' resumes, previous experience in Division Matches, or distinguished status. New team members may also be selected via the Depot Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition.

(c) Marines selected for the DRPT will be assigned to Weapons Field Training Battalion (WFTBN) for Temporary Additional Duty (TAD) by Depot Special Order (DSO). Marines who are replaced on the team by more qualified shooters, regardless of previously demonstrated skill, will return to their parent organization/primary duty.

b. Subordinate Element Mission

(1) Assistant Chief of Staff (AC/S) Manpower and Human Resources G-1. Prepare DSOs assigning designated Marines TAD as requested by the Commanding Officer, WFTBN, and approved by the Commanding General.

(2) AC/S, Operations and Training (G-3)

(a) Maintain staff cognizance over activities of the DRPT.

(b) Coordinate with commanders to minimize conflicts concerning membership in the DRPT.

(3) AC/S, Installation and Logistics (G-4)

(a) Provide weapons as requested by the commanding officer of WFTBN for training, civilian matches, and the CIAP.

(b) Provide the DRPT with ammunition as required, and assist with proper allocation of ammunition to match-hosting bases, via the Total Ammunition Management Information System (TAMIS) in order to minimize the physical transportation of ammunition off base by DRPT personnel.

(c) Provide the DRPT with a precision weapons repairer/technician, MOS 2112, to serve as the rifle team armorer.

(d) Provide the DRPT with (2) 15-seat passenger vans and (1) stake-bed truck in order to transport personnel and weapons on and off-base.

(4) AC/S, Comptroller. Provide support per ref (d).

(5) Commanding Officer, WFTBN

(a) Designate an OIC for the DRPT (OIC, DRPT).

(b) Submit a roster of selected team members to AC/S, G-1 for TAD orders.

(c) Organize, train, and assume administrative control over the DRPT.

(d) Equip the team and provide ammunition per references (d), (f), and (g). Ensure that DRPT equipment is segregated from all other

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equipment, and is used only by team members and in direct support of the activities of the DRPT.

(e) Ensure the team participates in competitive matches as directed.

(f) Use the fund administrator account as established by the Comptroller for the accounting and control of DRPT material and services funds.

(g) Submit budgetary requirements during annual Operations and Maintenance (O&M) budget calls and program reviews to the AC/S Comptroller per published guidance. Submit TAD requirements to AC/S, G-3.

(h) Coordinate with AC/S G-4 to arrange transportation for team weapons, equipment, and personnel.

(i) Coordinate with the Depot Ammunition Officer to ensure allocation of ammunition in TAMIS in order to avoid unnecessary transportation of ammunition by DRPT personnel.

(6) All Commanders

(a) Encourage those Marines interested in and qualified for competitive shooting to compete for a position on the DRPT through the Depot Intramural Rifle and Pistol Competition.

(b) Make all qualified Marines interested in competitive shooting available for tryout periods.

5. Administration and Logistics. The Depot Armory will provide all competition weapons. Competitors may not use personal weapons.

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to all Marines, Sailors and the Tri-Command area.

b. Signal. This Order is effective on the date signed.
